Course Title	Dressmaking				
Course Description	Learners will be guided through the purchase of fabrics and patterns. They will learn how to make basic pattern alterations, cut out, assemble and fit their garments. As well as this they will be taught basic dressmaking techniques and make samples to practice their skills. There will be plenty of help with using sewing machines if required. More advanced learners will be encouraged to make more complicated garments.

Acquire and practice some dressmaking skills and apply them.

By the end of the course learners should:

## **Beginners:**

- √ know how to use a lockstitch sewing machine
- √ know how to use a domestic dressmaking pattern
- ✓ understand the importance of a well fitted garment
- √ know how to assemble a garment in the correct order
- ✓ know a variety of dressmaking skills e.g. inserting zips, different seam finishes, pockets, hems etc.

#### Intermediates:

- ✓ appreciate how to use a variety of fabrics e.g. stretch
- √ know a variety of dressmaking skills to produce a professional finish e.g. attaching collars, cuffs, pockets, button etc.
- ✓ be able to make garments including more complicated skills and processes

### Advanced:

- ✓ work on achieving a professional finish to their garments
- ✓ make more complicated garments e.g. coats, jackets etc.
- √ alter patterns
- ✓ use luxurious fabrics
- ✓ work more independently

# **Progression – after this course what might you do next?**

Continue with more dressmaking courses to make and create garments including more advanced skills, techniques and fitting problems.

# How progress & success will be recorded

Trackers and completed samples and garments kept by the learners

## Additional course costs (e.g. visits, materials, books, equipment)

In order to make a garment you will need to purchase fabric, pattern and a sewing kit, this includes: stitch scissors, dressmaking shears, steel pins, tape measure. All of these will be discussed in the first session. Each student will also need at least one metre of fabric to make their samples, an old sheet or quilt cover is ideal.

Materials/equipment required for first class	You will need to bring a tape measure, pencil & pen, an old sheet or quilt cover to make samples. I would advise all beginners not to buy a pattern and fabric before the first session.
