Paediatric First Aid **Course Title** Level 3 (Blended Learning) An alternative to the 2 days in the classroom for childminders and carers who need to complete a Paediatric First Aid Course to comply with the requirements of Ofsted, EYFS, CSSIW and SureStart. This blended course offers a video based online course that is completed before attending a full day in the classroom with an instructor to complete the practical part of the course. The Online course is all video based, (as below) not slide based, so it's more like having your very own personal tutor on a flexible timetable. Start when you wish, review topics, stop and resume when it's convenient for you. Very easy to use even for the least computer or tech literate. Skills or qualifications needed for entry into the class

Students **must complete Day 1 online** prior to attending the classroom course.

Minimum age requirement of 16.

Course aims & objectives

The content of this course has been independently certified as conforming to universally accepted Continuous Professional Development (CPD) guidelines.

Topics include;

- Recording of incidents and accidents
- Legal framework, & responsibilities
- Unconscious casualty adult, child and infant
- Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation adult, child and infant
- Choking
- Contents of the first aid kit
- Child's response to extreme heat and cold. Febrile convulsions
- Dealing with blood loss and shock
- Burns and scalds
- Bleeding, grazes, embedded objects, knocked out teeth, mouth injury, eye injury, bruising, nosebleeds, objects in eyes, ears, nose
- Anaphylaxis
- Electric shock
- Poisoning
- Meningitis, Diabetes, Sickle Cell Anaemia, Croup, Septicaemia.
- Recognition and management of fractures, sprains and strains.

Progression – after this course what might you do next?

This certificate requires renewal every three years. Students can attend a one day refresher each year.

How progress & success will be recorded

Skills are assessed by continuous observation, practical exercises and a short theory exercise at the end of the course.

Additional course costs (e.g. visits, materials, books, equipment)

You must complete Day 1 of the course which is an online e-learning module (video based). The cost of this is £24.95 which must be paid to the course tutor. We will arrange for you to receive the active link for the online Day 1 module in advance of the face to face day at the College on 10^{th} June.
