Enrichment

- Historically we have always had a strong enrichment offering which includes Curriculum Extension Days, Activities Week and a broad and varied programme of clubs etc.
- Last year, 99.5% of all students participated in some form of enrichment.
- We ran 130 trips, 8 of which were international.
- We collapse curriculum time to ensure all students are given the opportunity of enhancing soft skills and experienced things outside of the classroom as we see this side of their education as equally important.
- Ofsted – Outstanding – we knew we wanted to do more. We always knew we had a strong offering, but were staff and students clear on what that was?

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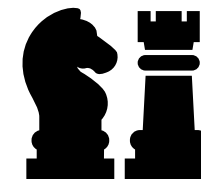

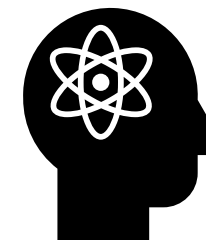

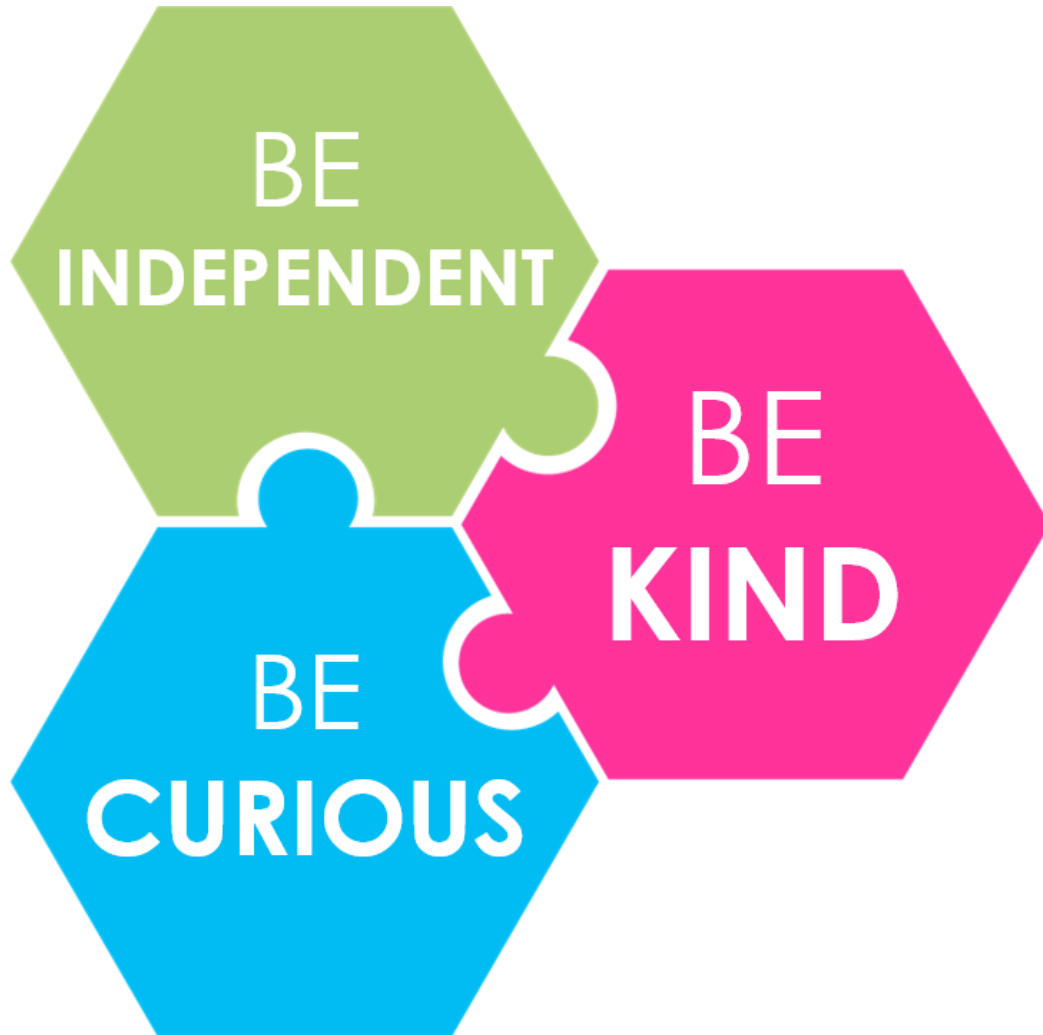
We usually find that, as students progress through the years, attendance to enrichment events tends to decrease year on year.
