

To all parents/carers of Year 11 students

Please be advised that next week's early school closure for Parent Consultations WILL NOT APPLY for our Year 11 cohort.

On Thursday 11th May, our Year 11 students will be lucky enough to receive a talk from Drew Dixon, a pioneer in the music industry who happened to be one of the key voices in the #metoo movement that brought issues such as coercive control, sexual harassment and misogynistic behaviour in male-dominated industries to the forefront. In the talk, Drew will tell her story in a moving and captivating way and will hopefully encourage all of our students to consider their own behaviours and place in the world, teaching them that unacceptable behaviour is unacceptable behaviour as well as the importance of speaking up and taking a stand.

Should you wish to learn more about Drew Dixon and her experiences within the music industry and the #metoo movement, there is a hard-hitting but utterly compelling documentary available on Amazon, titled 'On the record'.

Drew is experienced in speaking to groups of this age and her material is age appropriate, however the conversation will include topics of trauma and sexual abuse spoken about in a mature, frank and honest way. We encourage you to watch her documentary if possible. This is a necessary conversation, however if anyone feels distressed or concerned as a consequence there will be help and support on hand for students who need to access it.



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IMPORTANT SAFEGUARDING MESSAGE: PLEASE READ

Dear Parents and Carers,

We are aware that in an ever changing world more and more young people are communicating, socialising and exploring the world using online platforms. Following the return from the Easter break, we are concerned about reports of young people sharing images or videos of a sexual nature on social media platforms or via text messages with peers.

We regularly cover online safety in school within PSHE lessons, tutor times and assemblies and as part of our duty to safeguard pupils in school, we will follow up with pupils and parents where we are made aware that a situation of this nature may have occurred in order to support all the pupils involved.

We explain to pupils that when you are under 18 it is against the law to take, send or receive nude or sexual images or videos of anyone under 18, including yourself. It is also against the law for anyone to save or share a nude or sexual image or video of you even if they are under 18 themselves. We reassure pupils that the law is there to protect young people and not to get anyone in trouble.

We would ask you to support these conversations by speaking with pupils at home around anything they may have seen or been sent on their phones. We ask parents and carers to regularly check devices to ensure there is no upsetting or harmful content that could be circulated and to ensure that items that could contain harmful content are deleted.

More information can be found here to support with some of those conversation which we understand can be difficult, but which we know, will ensure we are working together to keep young people safe online and for them to feel confident knowing what action to take if something goes wrong.

COMBINED MINDS APP

Combined Minds is an app for parents and carers developed for teenage mental health charity Stem4 by Clinical Psychologists. The app aims to help families and friends support young people with their mental health.

Combined Minds use a 'strength based approach' which focuses on the positive attributes of the person and builds on resourcefulness and resilience. The app helps families to find ways to provide the right environment to help individuals they support affect their own change.

The app includes providing further information on certain needs such as anxiety and digital addiction as well as offering ways of accessing further help and useful suggestions of 'things you can do in the moment' to help support the young person.

We work with individual students, their families and external agencies.

What do we do at CamVC to safeguard your child?

- **Staff are vigilant** staff are very good at noticing small changes and listening to the concerns of those in our care. Tutors are well placed in this process, however all staff play an active role in this.
- **Designated Team** we have a specific team of people working each day to address concerns raised by staff, pupils, parents and external agencies. This team works to make sure concerns are addressed and the appropriate support is advised
- **Pupil Voice** we encourage pupils to speak to us or raise their concerns via the 'Report a Concern' button on their iPad




BOOK RECOMMENDATIONS

and Simon Montefiore

Life is an adventure. Anything in the world is possible - by will and by luck, with a moist carrot, a wet nose and a slice of mad courage! Shylo has always been the runt of the litter, the weakest and quietest of all of his family, his siblings spend their days making fun of him for not being like the rest of them. But when Shylo stumbles across a band of rats and overhears their evil plan to take a photo of the Queen in her nightie, it's up to this unlikely hero to travel to London and inform the Royal Rabbits of London about the diabolical plot! The Royal Rabbits of London have a proud history of protecting the royal family and now the secret society need to leap into action to stop the rats. But can a rabbit as feeble and shy as Shylo convince them that Queen is in danger? (Available from the School Library)



The Hutchinson book of Kings and Queens by Tony Robinson

Reporting your Child's Absence from School:

If your child is unwell and unable to attend school you have a legal requirement to inform the school on each day of absence. Please email (thecollege@cambournevc.org) or call the school on 01954 284000 by 9am every day of the absence and leave a message clearly stating the reason for absence and the child's full name and tutor group. If you fail to inform the school, we are legally required to make contact with you, to ensure the child's safety. Even if they have been absence on the previous day we cannot assume they are still at home poorly.

Appointments:

If your child misses registration for a medical or dental appointment, this is counted as an authorised absence. Please give advance notice, ideally 2 school days, by emailing thecol_lege@cambournevc.org with the dates and times the pupil is expected to be out of school and preferably with a copy of the appointment card/notification so that the absence can be authorised. As much as possible, pupils should be in school prior to/ after the appointment and out of school for as little time as possible.

Prior notification ensures the Year team and Reception staff are aware of your child arriving late / leaving early and the necessary arrangements can be put in place. If your child needs to leave early for an appointment, they should inform their teacher that they need to be excused early and make their own way down to Reception. The Reception staff will try to help locate children for appointments, but we do not always have someone available to do a collection from lessons.

Planned Absence Request:

For any planned absence which is not a medical appointment, please complete a <u>planned absence request form</u>. If possible, please submit this form two weeks before the absence. This will enable us to give you a response before the absence is taken. If a request for planned absence is not made, it is likely to be recorded as Unauthorised on your child's attendance record.

All pupils leaving early for appointments need to be collected by a parent to sign them out through our main Reception.

If your child has **lost an item of uniform**, please ask them to check with their **Year team office** in the first instance, or please **email <u>thecollege@cambournevc.org</u>** so that we can arrange for your child to check our unnamed items.

If your child needs a coat/jacket and would like to look through our unnamed items to find something suitable for them, please ask them to go to their Year team office or email the College.
