Principal's Letter

Dear Parents and Carers

We are continuing to make minor adaptations to the way that school is running, so that we can comply fully with COVID-19 measures while ensuring that learning goes as smoothly as possible. It is reassuring that the number of positive virus cases in Cambridgeshire remains amongst the lowest in the UK, with 5.2 cases per 100K population for the week of 1-7 September. (UK average: 23.4)

Staff Training

Today staff have been enjoying training sessions on subjects ranging from metacognition, equality and diversity, to pupils' mental health, whilst also spending time on forward-planning in case any level of remote education is needed for pupils over the next terms.

School Uniform

Please make sure that your child is continuing to wear correct school uniform – either regular uniform or PE kit as required. A reminder, please, that skirts should be worn 'toward the knee', that branded skirts and trousers are required, and that the school uniform jumper must be worn as the next layer above the polo shirt. If providing correct uniform is a problem, please do contact your child's year team in confidence, so that a way forward can be found.

Now that the weather has turned colder and wetter, please make sure that your child is wearing a coat on their journey to school. The building in now heated, so pupils will not need to wear outdoor coats in classrooms. If your child particularly feels the cold, please make sure they have an extra unseen layer underneath their polo shirt.

Bikes and Scooters

I have received a message from a concerned motorist about pupils riding four-abreast on the Cambourne roads: please discuss the importance of safe and considerate cycling with your children, and remember that the bike sheds are not always locked. Bikes and scooters are left at the owner's risk and we strongly recommend that they are always padlocked.

PE DEPARTMENT:

I hope that your son/daughter is getting into the swing of returning to school. Now that students are getting used to the systems in place, I would like to take some time to remind parents and carers of the expectations of students in their PE lessons.

PE Kit

Students should be coming to school in their full PE kit. If they have PE period 1-4 then students will be getting changed back into their school uniform after the lesson and must make sure that they have their correct and full school uniform with them. This is to ensure that students do not end up sitting in sweaty, smelly PE kit for the rest of the day if they have PE before lunch. Additionally, with more PE lessons being outside regardless of the weather, if it is raining, we do not want students to be sitting in wet kit for the rest of the day. If they have PE period 5-6 they will go home in their PE kit. We hope you can support the PE department and your child with this and ensure that they are organised by arriving in their PE kit and bringing their full school uniform including school shoes, when required.

Warm Layers

We have been very fortunate with the weather but at some point, this luck may run out. Students need to be prepared to be outside for their PE lessons in the wind and/or the rain and should ensure they bring enough layers to be comfortable. Base layers can be worn underneath the CamVC PE kit as long as the top layer is always a red CamVC top (either the red polo, the hoody, the fleece or the rugby shirt).

Water Bottles

Students must ensure they bring enough water for their PE lessons and fill their bottles up before the lesson. Unfortunately, due to the one-way system and avoiding crossing bubbles, students will not be allowed access water fountains during PE lessons to refill. Some students may wish to bring two water bottles.

Jewellery, Earrings and Nails

Due to every students' health and safety, students must ensure they remove all jewellery before a PE lesson; this includes necklaces, rings, bracelets as well as fabric jewellery and bracelets. Additionally, all earrings and piercings must be removed and left in their school uniform bag during their PE lesson. Students should not be wearing long acrylic nails to school. Nails should be of a natural length; when viewed from the palm side of the hand, the nails should not extend beyond the finger tips. Students who come to PE lessons with nails of a dangerous length will not be able to participate.

Governors Required - Voluntary Opportunities:




Hurricane Gold - 4 by Charles Higson


