Dear Parents and Carers

At school we are busy with preparation for next year: preparing timetables, budgets and resources for September – by which time, we're hopeful that we'll be able to put an end to separating pupils into year group 'bubbles' and allow full circulation to all areas of the school for everyone at all times.

Coronavirus

There is growing concern about a further increase in case numbers in secondary schools across Cambs. We have been instructed to retain all protective measures in school and have been advised to cancel the new intake activities on site for the Year 6 primary children who are coming to us in September. It's sad to have to do this for the second year running.

The Secretary of State for education has written an open letter to parents which you can find later in this bulletin. In this context, PLEASE continue to test your family and report the results on Wednesdays and Sundays. Last week, tests were reported for only 53% of our school population, and we know that the new strain of the virus is highly transmissible. If anyone in your family appears to have unusually developed hayfever, or has a headache, cold/runny nose, sore throat, or any of the classic symptoms of fever, cough and loss of taste/smell, please carry out a test immediately and if positive, isolate the whole household while a PCR test is carried out.

Peer on Peer Abuse

Many of you will be aware of the publicity surrounding the 'Everyone's Invited' campaign earlier this year, and of the subsequent Ofsted report. The school's response to this important issue can be seen on the facing page.

New Buildings

The design work on the accommodation for the planned school expansion from 2023 is going very well, and this week, Heads of Department have been looking at the small detail of their proposed new areas. Cambourne Village College: Response to the Ofsted Review of Sexual Abuse in Schools and Colleges

In June 2021, Ofsted published their report into the issue of sexual abuse in schools, which has come to national prominence following the *Everyone's Invited* campaign of earlier this year. The report makes sobering reading and its conclusion states:

This rapid thematic review has revealed how prevalent sexual harassment and online sexual abuse are for children and young people. It is concerning that for some children, incidents are so commonplace that they see no point in reporting them. This review did not analyse whether the issues are more or less prevalent for different groups of young people, and there may well be differences, but it found that the issues are so widespread that they need addressing for all children and young people. It recommends that schools, colleges and multiagency partners act as though sexual harassment and online sexual abuse are happening, even when there are no specific reports.

In response to this report, the College has produced an action plan to cover the following:

Safeguarding governance

Pupil experiences

A letter to secondary school and college parents in England on continuing regular Covid-19 testing.

From Gavin Williamson, Secretary of State for Education

Education Secretary Gavin Williamson has today written to secondary school and college parents and guardians in England to talk about the importance of regular testing when it comes to keeping Covid out of the classroom.

The Prime Minister announced on 14 June that step 4 of the roadmap would have to be paused for up to four weeks because of the spread of the new variant.

With the increase in cases with variants of concern, it is important to continue regular testing in order to detect cases of coronavirus, stay ahead of the virus and keep covid out of the classroom.

This means that regular asymptomatic testing for all will continue, and we need you and your children who are in secondary school or college to carry on testing at home, twice a week.

As you know, testing has been playing a vital role in our response to the virus. It is helping to break chains of transmission by identifying asymptomatic positive cases quickly. This means those who test positive can self-isolate, keeping other pupils and students in face-to-face education. Reporting all test results, positive or negative, helps the health experts have a clearer picture of any potential outbreaks in different parts of the country.

I want to thank you all for your efforts so far. I know that this has been an enormously challenging time for families, who have faced many pressures over the past 18 months. Your continued support in helping us fight the virus has been vital.

Secondary pupils and college students, households and their bubbles, along with school and college staff have now completed more than 50 million tests since these were introduced back in January. That really is an incredible number and we need you to continue your efforts.

It is wonderful to see so many children back in school and through your actions we can work together to keep everyone safe ensuring we can also keep your children in school with their friends.

Larger groups, of up to 30, can meet outdoors

(!) Wash your hands!



LFD Screening

What is LFD

- Lateral Flow Device
- These are used for screening purposes only and should <u>not</u> be used if someone is symptomatic
- These tests are quick and easy to use at home and help to identify those who may have Covid-19 but aren't symptomatic



Why should my child take part in weekly screening?

- One third of infected individuals have no symptoms and unknowingly spread coronavirus infection. Community LFD testing is one method to help identify and then isolate those infected. This helps reduce the risk for others in the wider community who are more at risk of infection such as the elderly and those who have underlying health conditions, contacts that students and students families have outside of school.
- The government guidance for schools should you wish to read is https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/guidance-for-full-opening-special-schools-and-other-specialist-settings/rapid-asymptomatic-testing-in-specialist-settings
- LFD testing is voluntary, and we respect any decision surrounding this however we would like to encourage this as much as possible

The weekly process

- Pupils should test on a WEDNESDAY and SUNDAY each week
- Results should be entered into TestRegister at <u>TestRegister.co.uk</u>

If you do not want to use this app please continue to use the <u>Covid 19 Information</u> Form to log your results if Positive.

If your LFD test result is **positive** please isolate as a household and book a <u>PCR test</u> immediately. We will be notified that the LFD test results is positive (if using TestRegister). Please notify us of the PCR result via <u>Covid 19 Information</u>

Covid-19 symptoms

 If you or anyone in your household has: a continuous cough, loss of taste/smell or high temperature, isolate as a household and book a PCR test ASAP. You should NOT use a LFD test at this point.




BOOK RECOMMENDATIONS

Safeguarding note

Whilst an appropriately trained adult will be present in each virtual meeting, not all representatives presenting will have an enhanced DBS as this is not a requirement as part of their job role. Presentations are recorded; as such, please be aware that any username used during the event may be visible to new viewers. It is recommended that full names are not used as usernames (either a combination of first initial and surname, or first name and initial of surname is preferred). There is an opportunity to engage with event representatives and to ask questions during events such as these; all communication should take place via the prescribed chat functions, and only during the event itself. Students accessing the sessions should be extra vigilant about disclosing any further personal, identifiable information.


Sixth Form Education at Radley College

To notify us of any planned absences, please visit the <u>Absences</u> page on our website and submit an Absence Request Form, with 2 school days' prior notice for this to be reviewed for authorisation.

APPOINTMENTS

We strongly encourage parents to make medical and dental appointments out of school hours where possible. Where this is not possible, pupils should be in school prior to/after the appointment and out of school for as little time as possible.

Missing registration AM or PM for a medical or dental appointment is counted as an authorised absence and advance notice is required for authorising these absences.

Please notify Reception of when an appointment is and the timings that the pupil will not be in school by emailing thecollege@cambournevc.org.

If we do not receive prior notification to a morning absence, we will contact home and the absence will only be authorised on proof of the medical appointment upon the pupil's return.

When leaving for an appointment, the pupil must sign out at Reception and be collected by their parent or carer, and they must sign back in when they return.
