#### **Dear Parents and Carers**

We have some particularly important messages for you this week.

#### **Covid Cases in School**

At the end of this week we have 23 cases of coronavirus among the pupil body, confirmed by PCR tests. We have spoken with Public Health England about this and are informed that no further measures above those outlined in our current risk assessment are necessary at present. Thank you to everyone who has been testing their children and reporting the results. Last week this only represented 58% of our pupils. Home testing and identification of asymptomatic cases is our main defence for our pupils against the virus.

#### Test at home - LFD testing

Please continue to test on WEDNESDAY and SUNDAY evening

**Please log results on TestRegister-** we will be notified. Please book a PCR immediately if you get a positive result.

#### Get a PCR test if your child/ someone in the household displays Covid-19 symptoms

If your child or anyone in your household has: loss of taste/smell, a high temperature or a new continuous cough, isolate and book a PCR test ASAP.

Please let us know by completing this form: Covid 19 Information

We will support any family who choose to keep their child off while someone else in the household undertakes a PCR test and awaits the results. We will confirm this with you on a case-by-case basis.

#### **Vaccinations**

Your child should have brought home a letter about the **FLU** vaccination that will be offered in the College to all year groups in the coming weeks. The Government recommends that all pupils have this vaccination. Please read the information and return your completed consent forms as soon as possible.

#### **Covid Vaccination**

The Government has announced that Covid vaccinations will be offered to all young people aged 12 to 15 this autumn. We do not have any dates for this at present. <a href="NHS leaflets">NHS leaflets</a> are available to provide more information to parents, carers and eligible young people on the vaccine, including how it works and what to expect after having the vaccine. We will let you know more information on this process as soon as we receive it.

#### Save Travel to and from School

We are receiving daily reports of our pupils cycling/scooting dangerously and inconsiderately on their journeys to and from school. If your child cycles or scoots to school, please discuss with them the importance of safe and careful cycling: drivers are reporting near-misses with alarming frequency.

At present, cyclists have to use the congested and dangerous road along Swansley Lane, or push their bikes on the footpath. A parent has started this online petition to have the cycle-path extended from the cricket pitch, along Swansley Lane to the school gates. This is something the school has been pursuing ever since opening and your support for this would be very welcome. <a href="https://chng.it/y2dznGffjS">https://chng.it/y2dznGffjS</a>

Pupils' exit from school along Swansley Lane is made much more hazardous by parents continuing to use it when picking up children. Please use the main car park if your child is unable to make the journey to and from school independently.

On a much more positive note, pupils have returned with very positive attitudes to learning and many are staying for after-school activities. Thank you for all your support in sending them in with such smart uniform.

Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> October


Held at Cambourne Village College, 10.30am-12.15pm

While some of the films confirm our understanding, many are surprising. Join us as we explore recordings of lived experience in 20th-century Britain and stories of migration.




# BOOK RECOMMENDATIONS



#### The Ballad of Songbirds and Snakes by Suzanne Collins

Return to the world of The Hunger Games in a compelling prequel that both informs the original trilogy and stands alone as a powerful, breathlessly exciting science fiction thriller.

It is the morning of the reaping that will kick off the tenth annual Hunger Games. In the Capitol, eighteen-year-old Coriolanus Snow is preparing for his one shot at glory as a mentor in the Games. He's been given the humiliating assignment of mentoring the female tribute from District 12, the lowest of the low. Their fates are now completely intertwined — every choice Coriolanus makes could lead to favour or failure, triumph or ruin. (Available from the School Library and on SORA)



#### A **Short History of the Motorcycle** by Richard Hammond

Richard Hammond's A Short History of the Motorcycle attempts to explain what it is about bikes and biking that calls to some people, leaving them powerless to resist.

This entertaining guide charts the history of the bike from its origins as a cheap and modest means of transport for the masses to its modern incarnations: a terrifying symbol of rebellion and menace, a high-tech racing machine and the rich kid's plaything. Matt Hayes will be talking about his work increasing access to the Cambridge University Museum of Zoology butterfly collection, where he is engaging audiences with the stories they preserve. 

#### **LFD Screening**

#### What is LFD

- Lateral Flow Device
- These are used for screening purposes only and should <u>not</u> be used if someone is symptomatic
- These tests are quick and easy to use at home and help to identify those who may have Covid-19 but aren't symptomatic



#### Why should my child take part in weekly screening?

- One third of infected individuals have no symptoms and unknowingly spread coronavirus infection. Community LFD testing is one method to help identify and then isolate those infected. This helps reduce the risk for others in the wider community who are more at risk of infection such as the elderly and those who have underlying health conditions, contacts that students and students families have outside of school.

- LFD testing is voluntary, and we respect any decision surrounding this however we would like to encourage this as much as possible

#### The weekly process

- Pupils should test on a WEDNESDAY and SUNDAY each week
- Results should be entered into TestRegister at <u>TestRegister.co.uk</u>

If you do not want to use this app please continue to use the <u>Covid 19 Information</u> Form to log your results if Positive.

If your LFD test result is **positive** please isolate as a household and book a <u>PCR test</u> immediately. We will be notified that the LFD test results is positive (if using TestRegister). Please notify us of the PCR result via <u>Covid 19 Information</u>

#### **Covid-19 symptoms**

 If you or anyone in your household has: a continuous cough, loss of taste/smell or high temperature, isolate as a household and book a PCR test ASAP. You should NOT use a LFD test at this point.





## APPOINTMENTS

We strongly encourage parents to make medical and dental appointments out of school hours where possible. Where this is not possible, pupils should be in school prior to/after the appointment and out of school for as little time as possible.

Missing registration AM or PM for a medical or dental appointment is counted as an authorised absence and advance notice is required for authorising these absences.
