#### Dear Parents and Carers

### **Review of Branded School Uniform**

In the summer term last year I wrote to ask your views on removing the requirement for pupils to wear branded trousers and skirts as part of their uniform, provided that appropriate non-branded items were worn in their place. Parents were in favour of this and it was agreed that we would run a pilot scheme for one year to assess the impact on pupil appearance.

Within this pilot, parents were asked to buy non-branded items that would resemble the branded uniform very closely. The following were among items stated as definitely unacceptable:

- Leggings
- Jeans
- Jogging bottoms
- Any sports-wear and stretch, skin-tight items.
- · Stretch 'tube' skirts
- Skirts with a hem more than 2 fingers' width above the knee at the start of the school year

Unfortunately, as the year has progressed, we have seen a distinct deterioration in standards of uniform. Numbers of girls are wearing leggings; many have very short skirts of thin stretchy material and numbers of boys are in jogging bottoms instead of trousers. Addressing these issues in school is taking far too much staff time and the appearance of some pupils on journeys to and from school is undermining our reputation in the community.

As such, with approval from our Governors, the school will be reinstating the requirement for pupils to wear branded trousers and skirts from September 2023; the revised uniform policy is at the end of this letter and on this link. Please note also the requirement for pupils to wear flat-soled shoes that can be polished.

One of our suppliers, Essential SchoolWear, ceased trading last year so while a second supplier is sought (the tendering process is overseen by the Cam Academy Trust) our sole supplier will be <u>Total Clothing</u>. If you would like your child to try on skirts and trousers to determine the right size before you buy, please contact <u>Mrs Collins</u>.

We will try to lessen the impact of the increased cost to families as much as we can. Our preworn uniform shop is available online all year round, and as always, parents are invited to send their requests via this <u>FORM</u> to arrange purchase of items if available. Donations of uniform in good condition to the shop are always very much appreciated.

We will support families who will find it hard to purchase the fully branded uniform. Families receiving free school meals and the Pupil Premium will be contacted separately with offers of support, and any family that has difficulty in providing full uniform for September is invited to contact their year team in confidence to agree a way forward.

I hope that we can rely on your support with this measure; we are determined to maintain the highest expectations of our pupils and addressing slipping standards of uniform is very important to this.

### **CAMBOURNE VILLAGE COLLEGE SCHOOL UNIFORM 2023-24**

We believe that wearing uniform helps to create a sense of identity and community in school. Our uniform is smart, practical and comfortable and we expect pupils to wear it with pride when at school, on journeys between home and school, and especially when representing the school on visits and fixtures. Pupils who do not meet our expectations about uniform will be asked to change and non-compliance will usually be sanctioned.

Shirts:	Branded College blue polo shirt (grey for Prefects). Any garment worn under the polo shirt must not be visible whether the shirt is worn buttoned or unbuttoned.
Sweatshirts:	Branded grey College sweatshirt (Black for Year 11). The College sweatshirt must always be worn as the next layer over the polo shirt, when another layer is required.
Trousers:	Branded College trousers – should finish below the ankle. They must be worn with plain socks which can be either grey, black or white.
Skirts:	Branded skirt – should finish at the knee. Skirts are worn with unpatterned black or neutral tights, <i>or</i> with socks in either grey, black or white.
Shorts	Branded shorts may be worn. They must be worn with plain socks in either grey, black or white.
Shoes:	Plain black leather or leather-style shoes that can be polished, with a flat sole. No sandals, branding, canvas/fabric style shoes, boots, trainers, or trainer-style shoes, are allowed.
Jewellery:	The only jewellery permitted is one small, plain stud in each pierced ear. Nose studs and other facial piercings (including temporary blank/neutral retainers) are not acceptable.  All jewellery and piercings must be completely removed for PE. Earrings cannot be taped or covered at any time within the school. Please ensure that new piercing is only done at the beginning of the summer holiday and not done within the academic year.
Hairstyles:	Extreme haircuts and colours as judged by the College are not allowed.
Make Up	Natural-looking make-up may be worn. Long fingernails are not acceptable for safety reasons. Fingernails should not be visible above the fingers when the hand is viewed from the palm.
Outside wear	When travelling to and from school and when outside the school building, pupils are allowed to wear all items of outdoor clothing, including coats, jackets, hoodies, scarves, gloves and hats. None of these should have inappropriate slogans or logos. These should be removed before entering the building.

### Lunch debt reminders.

Please could all parents be mindful of the amount of money on your child's parent pay account. This is especially relevant to our <u>YEAR 11 PARENTS</u> who will need to top up accounts if your child is in debt. Accounts in debt need to be cleared before half term. We will never let your child go hungry at lunch, and if you need any help with adding money or if you are struggling, please contact your child's year team in confidence.

### **Year 10 Politics Club Speeches**

### **Mental Health Awareness Week 2023**

This year the theme is **anxiety**. In polling carried out by the Mental Health Foundation, <u>anxiety</u> was the number one mental health issue people told them they wanted to focus on. Anxiety is very common, and we want to use the week to explore people's experiences, increase understanding of the root causes and share some of the things that can help to reduce anxiety's toll on our lives.

Because we use the vocabulary of anxiety/anxious in many conversations there can be confusion about the difference between feeling anxious and a diagnosis of anxiety. Explained simply, everyone experiences feelings of anxiety at some time – for example: before starting a new job, when IT fails during a presentation or when there's a change in living arrangements - but it is when signs and symptoms last longer, are more severe and interfere with everyday life/work or relationships that a professional may diagnose an anxiety disorder.

What you know and understand about anxiety will help you and can also support you to help others.

Do you know which signs to look out for? Would you know how to support or signpost someone?

### **POST 16 OPEN EVENTS**







# Journey back to freedom: The Olaudah Equiano story by Catherine John-

son

Recounts the true story of Olaudah Equiano's life from being kidnapped from his village in Africa as a child and sold into slavery to earning his freedom and settling in London. From the horrors of the slave trade to a book that changed the world, Catherine Johnson celebrates the incredible life of Olaudah Equiano in this gripping true story. Born in what is now Nigeria in 1745, Olaudah Equiano's peaceful childhood was brought to an abrupt end when he was captured and enslaved aged 11. He spent much of the next eight years of his life at sea, seeing action in the Seven Years' War. When he was finally able to buy his freedom, he went on to become a prominent member of the abolition movement and in 1789 published one of the first books by a Black African writer.

### Reporting your Child's Absence from School:

If your child is unwell and unable to attend school you have a legal requirement to inform the school on each day of absence. Please email (<a href="mailto:thecollege@cambournevc.org">thecollege@cambournevc.org</a>) or call the school on 01954 284000 by 9am every day of the absence and leave a message clearly stating the reason for absence and the child's full name and tutor group. If you fail to inform the school, we are legally required to make contact with you, to ensure the child's safety. Even if they have been absence on the previous day we cannot assume they are still at home poorly.

### **Appointments:**

If your child misses registration for a medical or dental appointment, this is counted as an authorised absence. Please give advance notice, ideally 2 school days, by emailing <a href="mailto:thecol\_lege@cambournevc.org">thecol\_lege@cambournevc.org</a> with the dates and times the pupil is expected to be out of school and preferably with a copy of the appointment card/notification so that the absence can be authorised. As much as possible, pupils should be in school prior to/ after the appointment and out of school for as little time as possible.

Prior notification ensures the Year team and Reception staff are aware of your child arriving late / leaving early and the necessary arrangements can be put in place. If your child needs to leave early for an appointment, they should inform their teacher that they need to be excused early and make their own way down to Reception. The Reception staff will try to help locate children for appointments, but we do not always have someone available to do a collection from lessons.

### **Planned Absence Request:**

For any planned absence which is not a medical appointment, please complete a <u>planned absence request form</u>. If possible, please submit this form two weeks before the absence. This will enable us to give you a response before the absence is taken. If a request for planned absence is not made, it is likely to be recorded as Unauthorised on your child's attendance record.

All pupils leaving early for appointments need to be collected by a parent to sign them out through our main Reception.

If your child has **lost an item of uniform**, please ask them to check with their **Year team office** in the first instance, or please **email <u>thecollege@cambournevc.org</u>** so that we can arrange for your child to check our unnamed items.

If your child needs a coat/jacket and would like to look through our unnamed items to find something suitable for them, please ask them to go to their Year team office or email the College.
