
MPORTANT! REMINDERS

Food Technology Lessons

Year 9 Options

Year 9 pupils have been contacted over the last few weeks, if one of their reserve option choices were needed. All other Year 9 pupils will receive confirmation of their option subject allocations on return to school after half term. Thank you for your ongoing support and patience during this process.



Year 10 Mock Exams

The Year 10 Exams period will take place from **Tuesday 27th June up to, and including, Tuesday 11th July**.

The main aim of these exams is to provide Year 10 students, and their teachers, with assessment of the progress they have made in mastering the content of the first half of the GCSE syllabuses, and provide guidance for the revision required along-side learning the remaining content in Year 11.

The results will also start to inform decisions for tier of entry for some subjects, alongside the results from the Year 11 Mocks.

Year 10 GCSE History revision sessions are starting on 5th June!

They will be every Monday 3.10pm to 4pm with Mr Green and Mr Olivey in the Blue Wing upstairs. Please remind your children that they should be using their revision schedule, but they can also speak to Miss Angell if they have any questions or concerns.

Year 11 Study Leave

We would like to thank you for your ongoing support over the GCSE exam period, in ensuring that your child arrives on time each day, fully equipped for each exam, revision session and timetabled lesson.



From this point onwards, we will only insist on Year 11s attending school for their exams. For a morning exam, they must be present in school by **1pm**. However, if a student has been told that they have an earlier start time for an afternoon exam (as they will be sitting two papers back-to-back due to an exam clash) they should aim to be in school by **12.40pm**.



Combined Minds is an app for parents and carers developed for teenage mental health charity Stem4 by Clinical Psychologists. The app aims to help families and friends support young people with their mental health.

Combined Minds use a 'strength based approach' which focuses on the positive attributes of the person and builds on resourcefulness and resilience. The app helps families to find ways to provide the right environment to help individuals they support affect their own change.

The app includes providing further information on certain needs such as anxiety and digital addiction as well as offering ways of accessing further help and useful suggestions of 'things you can do in the moment' to help support the young person.

<u>Instrumental & Singing Lessons (5 week taster)</u>

If your child might be interested in getting instrumental lessons, or singing lessons in the Music Department, they could sign-up for a 5-week taster starting after half-term.

5-weeks is a great way of seeing how they get on with lessons, and inspire them musically ahead of the summer holiday – and if they enjoy the lessons they can sign up for a full term in September.

Pupils in KS3 all classes need to have a pair of earphones or headphones with them to use in their weekly music lessons. These are used through many of their lessons when they are working on keyboards, and will greatly help them in these lessons.

Pupils need to have a standard mini-jack connector (rather than Bluetooth or apple) – and they can be purchased for as little as £2 from supermarkets or online. 



Barons' Sporting Bursary



- Paying for the entry costs of an event like the Cambridge Schools Cross Country
- Paying to attend a sports coaching or refereeing course such as a FA young officials course

Reporting your Child's Absence from School:

If your child is unwell and unable to attend school you have a legal requirement to inform the school on each day of absence. Please email (thecollege@cambournevc.org) or call the school on 01954 284000 by 9am every day of the absence and leave a message clearly stating the reason for absence and the child's full name and tutor group. If you fail to inform the school, we are legally required to make contact with you, to ensure the child's safety. Even if they have been absence on the previous day we cannot assume they are still at home poorly.

Appointments:

If your child misses registration for a medical or dental appointment, this is counted as an authorised absence. Please give advance notice, ideally 2 school days, by emailing thecol-lege@cambournevc.org with the dates and times the pupil is expected to be out of school and preferably with a copy of the appointment card/notification so that the absence can be authorised. As much as possible, pupils should be in school prior to/ after the appointment and out of school for as little time as possible.

Prior notification ensures the Year team and Reception staff are aware of your child arriving late / leaving early and the necessary arrangements can be put in place. If your child needs to leave early for an appointment, they should inform their teacher that they need to be excused early and make their own way down to Reception. The Reception staff will try to help locate children for appointments, but we do not always have someone available to do a collection from lessons.

Planned Absence Request:

For any planned absence which is not a medical appointment, please complete a <u>planned absence request form</u>. If possible, please submit this form two weeks before the absence. This will enable us to give you a response before the absence is taken. If a request for planned absence is not made, it is likely to be recorded as Unauthorised on your child's attendance record.

All pupils leaving early for appointments need to be collected by a parent to sign them out through our main Reception.

POST 16 OPEN EVENTS


