
Completely black leather or leather-style shoes that can be polished, with a flat sole. No contrasting branding, sandals, pumps, canvas/fabric style shoes, or boots.






































SCHOOL UNIFORM

In addition to Wells Disease (caused by rat urine) which can attack vital organs and in rare cases, even result in death, we have more water borne diseases in Lake Ewart. Not to mention any snag hazards, which could pull them under.

Even for the little ones, paddling or just dangling feet in the water is still risky. For all the lakes in Cambourne, not just Lake Ewart, swimming is not allowed.

Year 10 Mock Exams


The Year 10 Exams period will take place from **Tuesday 27th June up to, and including, Tuesday 11th July**.

The main aim of these exams is to provide Year 10 students, and their teachers, with assessment of the progress they have made in mastering the content of the first half of the GCSE syllabuses, and provide guidance for the revision required alongside learning the remaining content in Year 11.




Please return all library books before the start of the summer holidays!


Musical Instruments Gathering Dust...?




Ghost wood song

by Erica Waters

If I could have a fiddle made of Daddy's bones, I'd play it. I'd learn all the secrets he kept. Shady Grove inherited her father's ability to call ghosts from the grave with his fiddle, but she also knows the fiddle's tunes bring nothing but trouble and darkness. But when her brother is accused of murder, she can't let the dead keep their secrets. In order to clear his name, she's going to have to make those ghosts sing. Family secrets, a gorgeously resonant LGBTQ love triangle, and just the right amount of creepiness make this young adult debut a haunting and hopeful story about facing everything that haunts us in the dark. *Ghost wood song* is a lush and eerie first novel.

Reporting your Child's Absence from School:

If your child is unwell and unable to attend school you have a legal requirement to inform the school on each day of absence. Please email (thecollege@cambournevc.org) or call the school on 01954 284000 by 9am every day of the absence and leave a message clearly stating the reason for absence and the child's full name and tutor group. If you fail to inform the school, we are legally required to make contact with you, to ensure the child's safety. Even if they have been absence on the previous day we cannot assume they are still at home poorly.

Appointments:

If your child misses registration for a medical or dental appointment, this is counted as an authorised absence. Please give advance notice, ideally 2 school days, by emailing thecol_lege@cambournevc.org with the dates and times the pupil is expected to be out of school and preferably with a copy of the appointment card/notification so that the absence can be authorised. As much as possible, pupils should be in school prior to/ after the appointment and out of school for as little time as possible.

Prior notification ensures the Year team and Reception staff are aware of your child arriving late / leaving early and the necessary arrangements can be put in place. If your child needs to leave early for an appointment, they should inform their teacher that they need to be excused early and make their own way down to Reception. The Reception staff will try to help locate children for appointments, but we do not always have someone available to do a collection from lessons.

Planned Absence Request:

For any planned absence which is not a medical appointment, please complete a <u>planned absence request form</u>. If possible, please submit this form two weeks before the absence. This will enable us to give you a response before the absence is taken. If a request for planned absence is not made, it is likely to be recorded as Unauthorised on your child's attendance record.

All pupils leaving early for appointments need to be collected by a parent to sign them out through our main Reception.

Combined Minds use a 'strength based approach' which focuses on the positive attributes of the person and builds on resourcefulness and resilience. The app helps families to find ways to provide the right environment to help individuals they support affect their own change.

The app includes providing further information on certain needs such as anxiety and digital addiction as well as offering ways of accessing further help and useful suggestions of 'things you can do in the moment' to help support the young person.

- **Designated Team** we have a specific team of people working each day to address concerns raised by staff, pupils, parents and external agencies. This team works to make sure concerns are addressed and the appropriate support is advised
- **Pupil Voice** we encourage pupils to speak to us or raise their concerns via the 'Report a Concern' button on their iPad
