Pencil case must include:

- Pencil
- Long ruler
- Rubber and sharpener
- Compass
- Protractor
- Blue or black writing biros or pens

The Reading Passport –

Aim: To keep the reading journey going

- Read (share or listen to) at least 1 book
- Hand in the completed passport to their English teacher in September

- Librarian has visited/will visit feeder primaries and has emailed all non-feeder primaries
- Available to download from our new intake page



Emergency medication and support

Please inform the school if your child

- Needs any emergency medication such as adrenaline (EpiPen/Jext), Buccolam or asthma inhaler
- Needs to have any routine medication kept in the first aid room (eg pain relief, methylphenidate)

If so, on the first day of school please supply the medication in a clearly labelled box/bag together with

- The appropriate signed parental consent form(s)
- A copy of the child's asthma/allergy/epilepsy action plan, or letter from GP/consultant

If your child needs to carry medication in school (eg emergency medication or migraine relief), please complete the appropriate consent form and drop it into reception or the first aid room

School Uniform: Smart, practical, comfortable and affordable

Sweatshirts	Branded grey College sweatshirt (Branded black sweatshirt for Years 10 & 11 - from September 2025).	No other sweatshirts, jacket or hooded top is permitted.
Polo Shirts	Branded College blue polo shirt. (Grey or purple for Prefects).	No other shirt is permitted.
Trousers	Plain black, formal, tailored, loose fltting, school trousers. These should sit on top of the shoe (see examples).	No skin-tight/stretchy/slim flt trousers, leggings or 'jeans' type trousers.
Skirts	Plain black school style skirt touching the knee or longer. <u>Note</u> : Skirts should be loose enough to remain at the knee (see examples below).	No short, skin-tight, or stretchy skirts are allowed.
Shorts	Plain black knee length shorts of a formal style (see examples).	No sport shorts or other style or colour permitted
Socks / Tights	Plain black, grey, or white.	No other style or colour permitted
Shoes	Completely black leather or leather- style sensible shoes with a flat sole	No contrasting branding, trainers, sandals, pumps, canvas/fabric style shoes, high heels, or boots.

Jewellery	One watch, one pair of small stud earrings, one ring. No facial piercings.	No other visible jewellery is permitted. All jewellery and piercings must be completely removed for PE/Dance.
Hairstyles	Hair colour should be natural. Hair accessories should be functional and discreet.	Extreme hair colours or hairstyles as judged by the College are not allowed. No hats or bandanas allowed.
Make Up / Nails	Natural-looking make-up may be worn. Nail varnish is permitted.	False/acrylic nails. Long nails are not allowed - nail length should not go past the fingertips.
Outside wear	On their journey into school and in outside social spaces, pupils are allowed to wear all items of outdoor clothing, including coats, jackets, hoodies, scarves, gloves, and hats.	No outside wear inside the building. Outdoor wear should not have any inappropriate slogans or logos.
Earphones / Mobile phones	Students are allowed to bring these to school and will switch these off and place in schoolbag upon arrival to school.	No earphones / mobile phones to be visible on school site. These will be conflscated by staff if seen.

Jumper	Braded Red Cam VC Hoodie (or branded Fleece). Or Branded blue Sports Leader Hoodie.	No other sweatshirts, hoodies or zip hoodies of any colour permitted.		
Shorts	Black plain sports shorts, to be at least mid-thigh in length	No skin-tight shorts, such as cycling shorts, short shorts or shorts of any other style or colour apart from black permitted		
Skort	Black plain sport skort	No other colour skorts permitted		
Trousers	Black plain tracksuit trousers or jogging bottoms	No other colour sport trousers or trousers or joggers with Logos are permitted		
Leggings	Black plain leggings or black leggings with CAM VC logo down the leg	No other colour leggings or branded leggings are permitted.

Trainers	Indoor trainers	No school shoes or pumps such as Vans, Converse, Air Force 1s.		
Astro Trainers	Outdoor "Astro-Style" studs on the 3G pitch. Astros are training shoes that have soles with a higher-than-normal raised moulded pattern, for use on artificial grass surfaces. Boots need to have either dimpled soles, plastic studs or moulded blades	No other trainers should be used. Metal capped, or metal studs are not permitted for health and safety reasons and for maintenance of the artificial pitch surface.		
Jewellery / Nails	All jewellery and piercings must be completely removed for PE/Dance.	Long nails are not allowed - nail length should not go past the fingertips.		
Socks	Plain black long socks or other small black or white trainer socks	No daily wear socks to be worn during PE lessons		
Shin Pads	Full size shin pads must be worn under long black socks for both football and hockey	No shin guards that only cover a small portion of the shin		
Gum Shields	Gum shields to be worn for both rugby and hockey


On the days your child has PE, they are to attend school in their PE kit, but bring school uniform to change into (unless their PE lesson is after lunch).

Mobile Phones
