The grid below sets out what to expect, and where to find work, should your child be learning remotely in different potential situations relating to school closure and remote learning.

Your child is at home self-isolating but is well enough to do schoolwork. This applies in a number of situations, whether as a small number of pupils traced from a case within school, or due to their own symptoms or those of a household member, or due to being tracked by the NHS. It will not necessarily be an Assignment and therefore will not necessarily trigger an alert to pupils. Students will need to look within the 'Posts' and the 'Files' sections of their Class group on Teams. They may, within Teams, then be directed to another platform, such as the CATalogue, to find their task – but Teams should always be the first port of call, and will act as a signpost.	If it is an Assignment, there will be instructions to submit work via Teams. Otherwise, students can complete work and do not need to submit it. Students should see it as their responsibility to complete work and not expect their teacher to request evidence of it; they should request help via email if need be. Please understand that teachers, who have full teaching timetables in school, will not be able to respond straight away.
