



### **Cambourne Village College Summer School 2023**

From the 21<sup>st</sup>-24<sup>th</sup> August, we held the 2023 Summer School. Upcoming Year 7 students in the local area who are currently in receipt of Free School Meals were invited for 34days of lessons and activities to ease the transition from Primary to Secondary education. We hope that having spent a few days at the school and having met some key members of staff, students will be able to hit the ground running when they join CamVC in September.

45 students were invited to attend and 23 attended. Particular thanks goes to Sarah Ecclestone (Pupil Premium Assistant) for contacting parents/carers and encouraging attendance.

This year we offered a range of sessions (please see full timetable below). CamVC staff offered most sessions with the aim of consolidating key learning in certain subjects as well as familiarizing the students with the way in which lessons operate at Secondary School. We had external input from the Cavendish Laboratory at the University of Cambridge. Stephen Martin and Jacob Butler delivered a very engaging session in which students built free-standing bridges, towers, and cranes. On the Wednesday we took the students by public transport to Cambridge. This was a wonderful day which included a guided punting tour along the Cambridge backs and visit to one of the city's bookshops — each student was gifted a book of their choice. We also held some informal Sport and Team-building sessions to foster friendships before the arrive in September.
